### TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

### 1. GENERAL

1.1 PUBLIC HEALTH STATEMENT: The Eisteddfod Council of Queensland (hereafter referred to as ECQ) prioritises the health and safety of competitors and audience members.

By entering Items or purchasing or accepting tickets, attendees acknowledge that, even with control measures in place at Eisteddfod venues, there remains an unquantifiable risk of transmission of viral illness including COVID-19. By attending the Eisteddfod, attendees acknowledge that they have considered those risks and their own personal circumstances, including any health condition or vulnerability that they may have, and the circumstances of persons with whom they will be in close contact following attendance at the Eisteddfod. The ECQ will rely on this health issue waiver and proceed on the basis that all attendees acknowledge and accept these risks to attend the Eisteddfod. The ECQ relies on entrants and purchasers of tickets to bring this health issue waiver to the attention of any guest(s).

Attendees who do not comply with the directions of Management to comply with any government health directions may be refused entry to, or removed from, the venue.

1.2 VALIDITY OF CONDITIONS: All Terms, Conditions and Rules as printed in the Schedule of Events are valid for and continue for the duration the Eisteddfod.

Notwithstanding this, the ECQ reserves the right to alter any Terms, Conditions or Rules or to cancel an Item as may be necessary. Should any such alteration be made, affected competitors will be notified.

- 1.3 AMATEUR STATUS: All competitions are open to amateurs only, except where otherwise specified. "Amateur" is defined as one who does not derive a substantial source of income from the exercise of his or her talent in the particular class for which he or she may have entered. (N.B. Teachers of piano or voice who are not professional performers are not disqualified from performing in the Lieder Item as singer or as pianist).
- 1.4 ENTRY NAME: The competitor must compete under their legal name and not a stage name.
- 1.5 COMPETITOR AGE: A competitor's age shall be defined as their age at 31 December in the year of the competition. Where age limits are set, no competitor may enter outside his or her own age group. A competitor in an "Open" Item may be of any age.
- 1.6 ENTRY ACCEPTANCE: The ECQ reserves the right to reject an entry. The ECQ may disqualify a competitor for breaching one or more of these rules at any time up to and/or following the performance.
- 1.7 PUBLICITY: The competitor agrees to the publication of their name in relation to the results and other activities of the ECQ and the Eisteddfod in which they are entered. The competitor also agrees to waive any and all rights now and in the future to any and all audio, visual and audio-visual recordings made by or on behalf of the ECQ in relation to this event, which may then be used by the ECQ in the conduct of their activities in perpetuum. The ECQ may retain relevant personal details for future eisteddfodau held by, or under the auspices of, the ECQ.
- 1.8 PRELIMINARIES: Preliminaries may be held in any Item except Choral Items.
- 1.9 WITHDRAWALS: Competitors should advise the Eisteddfod Office if withdrawing from an Item of competition. There will be no refund of Entry Fees.
- 1.10 PROTESTS: All protests must be in writing and lodged with the Eisteddfod Office within one hour of the conclusion of the Session containing the Item to which the protest relates. A protest shall be accompanied by a fee of \$20 that shall be refunded if the protest is upheld.
- 1.11 RISK: Competitors appear in all Items entirely at their own risk.

### **2. STAGE PRESENTATION**

- 2.1 PIANO PITCH: Pianos shall be tuned to A440 for all musical disciplines. The use of prerecorded electronic backing or accompaniment is permitted only where stated in an Item's rules. Where permitted, backing tracks must adhere to the conditions in Clause 4.5.
- 2.2 MUSIC STANDS: In all musical Items featuring groups of four or fewer, the ECQ will provide music stands for competitors. A music stand will be provided for conductors.
- 2.3 PROPS: Where permitted in the Item rules, props must adhere to the following conditions:
  - (a) Props must be of a suitable size and nature to allow placement and removal by competitors quickly and with minimal disruption.
  - (b) All props must be removed from stage immediately after each performance. Storage of props will be at the discretion of the ECQ, dependent on programming and backstage space available.
  - (c) A small table and two chairs will be made available for use if required in Music Theatre and Light Opera solos, duets and trios (Items 126, 139, 155, and 156) and Speech & Drama Items (Items 301, 305, 308, 351, 355, and 358).
  - (d) Glass, naked flame, objects thrown from the stage into the audience, liquid, fine particles (eg. confetti) that may difficult to remove from the stage, or any other props that may endanger competitors or audience are prohibited.

### **3. CHORAL COMPETITIONS**

- 3.1 CHORAL ELIGIBILITY requirements are as follows:
  - (a) Choral competitions in their respective classes are open to any body of unpaid singers.
  - (b) No member may sing in more than one competing choir in a particular Item.
  - (c) No member may sing in both Items 104 Choral Contest Soprano and Alto Voices and 105 Choral Contest Tenor and Bass Voices.
  - (d) No member may sing in both Items 113 Vocal Ensemble Soprano and Alto Voices and 114 Vocal Ensemble Tenor and Bass Voices.
- 3.2 USE OF SOLO PARTS: Where solo parts are specified in Choral Items, the parts so marked may be sung, at the discretion of the Conductor, either collectively by the whole of the voices, or by no fewer than three selected voices, in the respective section of the choir. However, in Item 107 Music Theatre Contest only, solo singing, speech, or movement, in short sections in the context of an ensemble cast, are permitted.
- 3.3 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS are as follows:
  - (a) SET PIECE EDITIONS: Competitors are advised to confirm editions of set pieces with the ECQ.
  - (b) OWN CHOICE RESTRICTION: Choral bodies may not re-use a set piece or any of their own choice selections for three Queensland Eisteddfodau following its use in the competition. Refer to Clause 7 for further information.
  - (c) HAND MOVEMENTS: Hand movements and choreography are permitted only where and if indicated in the musical score (except Items 107 Music Theatre Contest, 108 Novelty Chorus Contest, and 119 Youth Music Theatre Contest).
  - (d) ACCOMPANIED OWN CHOICE: "Accompanied" means with pitched accompaniment that is integral to the tonality of the performance.
  - (e) TIME LIMIT: Time limit is a maximum of seven (7) minutes per piece.

- 3.4 USE OF LANGUAGE: Where specified, Item Rules regarding the use of languages other than English must be adhered to. Where unspecified (Items 101 to 106, 110 to 114, 116 to 118, and 120), own choice selections may be sung in English or the original language.
- 3.5 CHORAL TROPHIES: Each choral trophy offered remains the property of the ECQ until won outright. In the interim, a trophy may be held by the winner at one Eisteddfod and returned prior to the commencement of the next Eisteddfod. The temporary holders of the trophy will be responsible for its safekeeping, insurance, engraving and return.
- 3.6 CHORAL AGGREGATES: These will be determined as follows and apply to the Items listed below:
  - (a) CALCULATION OF AGGREGATES: Choral Aggregates shall be calculated on the basis of allocating 7 points for 1st Place, 6 points for 2nd Place, 5 points for 3rd Place, 4 points for 4th Place, 3 points for 5th Place, 2 points for 6th Place, and 1 point for 7th Place in each of the relevant Items. Places are determined by the marks awarded by the adjudicator. Ties may occur in aggregates.
  - (b) GRAND CHAMPION CHOIR: The Grand Champion Choir is defined as the choir which gains the highest point aggregate in the Chief Choral, Grand Madrigal, Sacred Choral, Choral — Soprano and Alto Voices, Choral — Tenor and Bass Voices, and Modern Chorus Contests (Items 101 to 106).
  - (c) LINDSAY STATHAM MEMORIAL CHALLENGE AGGREGATE: The Challenge Aggregate winner is defined as the choir which gains the highest point aggregate in the Sacred Choral Contest, Choral Contest — Tenor and Bass Voices, and Welsh Hymn Singing (Items 103, 105 and 109).
  - (d) YOUTH CHORAL AGGREGATE: The Youth Choral Aggregate winner is defined as the choir which gains the highest point aggregate in the Intermediate Choral, Youth Modern Chorus and Youth Music Theatre Contests (Items 116, 118 and 119).
  - (e) Any Choir entering more than one group in any contest included in an aggregate must nominate the group to be included in the aggregate calculations at the time of entry.

### 4. VOCAL COMPETITIONS

- 4.1 VOCAL ELIGIBILITY requirements are as follows:
  - (a) Competitors may not appear more than once in any one Item.
  - (b) No competitor shall be allowed to compete in two vocal classes, such as Soprano and Mezzo-Soprano/Contralto.
  - (c) Competitors in Item 132 Operatic Aria must compete in at least two other solo vocal Items.
- 4.2 RESTRICTED ADULT VOCAL SOLO ITEMS: Items 142 to 145 inclusive are restricted to:
  - (a) those who have not won an Adult Vocal Championship (Items 127 to 131) for two (2) successive Eisteddfodau held by, or under the auspices of, the ECQ.
  - (b) Subject to the restrictions in 4.2(a) above, competitors may compete in a Restricted Adult Vocal Solo (Items 142 to 145) and the respective Vocal Championship (Items 127 to 131) at the same Eisteddfod.
- 4.3 TRANSPOSITIONS: Transpositions are permitted for Vocal Solo music, except in Championship Items (Items 127 to 131), Operatic Aria (Item 132), and Sacred Oratorio or Cantata Solo (Item 134).
- 4.4 USE OF LANGUAGE: Attention should be paid to the Item Rules regarding the use of languages other than English.
- 4.5 BACKING TRACKS: Backing tracks, which may be used for accompaniment only in Modern or Contemporary Ballad Items (Items 140, 141, 157, and 158), must not include any vocal parts.

Competitors are responsible for providing their own portable battery-powered speaker/s, which may be operated by another person from the front of the venue.

- 4.6 VOCAL AGGREGATES: These will be determined as follows and apply to the Items listed below:
  - (a) CALCULATION OF AGGREGATES: The Vocal Championship Aggregate and Youth Vocal Aggregate (16 to 20 years) shall each be calculated on the basis of 6 points for 1st Place, 5 points for 2nd Place, 4 points for 3rd Place, 3 points for 4th Place, 2 points for 5th Place, and 1 point for 6th Place in each of the relevant Items. Places are determined by the marks awarded by the adjudicator. Ties may occur in aggregates.
  - (b) VOCAL CHAMPIONSHIP AGGREGATE: The Vocal Championship Aggregate winner is defined as the competitor who gains the highest point aggregate in their respective Vocal Championship (Items 127 to 131), plus the Operatic Aria, Art Song, and Sacred Oratorio or Cantata Solo (Items 132 to 134).
  - (c) YOUTH VOCAL AGGREGATE: The Youth Vocal Aggregate (16 to 20 years) winner is defined as the competitor who gains the highest point aggregate in the Youth Vocal Championship, Song by Australian Composer, Traditional Ballad or Folk Song Solo, and Sacred Solo (Items 151 to 154).

### **5. INSTRUMENTAL COMPETITIONS**

- 5.1 INSTRUMENTAL ELIGIBILITY: Competitors may compete more than once in any one Item (excepting Piano Items 201, 205, and 208), provided it is on another instrument.
- 5.2 INSTRUMENTAL STAGE SET-UP: For all instrumental groups (3 players or more), stage plans shall be received by the ECQ no later than one week prior to the commencement of the Eisteddfod.
- 5.3 INSTRUMENTAL AGGREGATE: This will be determined as follows and apply to the Items listed below:
  - (a) CALCULATION OF AGGREGATE: The Instrumental Championship Aggregate shall be calculated on the basis of 6 points for 1st Place, 5 points for 2nd Place, 4 points for 3rd Place, 3 points for 4th Place, 2 points for 5th Place, and 1 point for 6th Place in each of the relevant Items. Places are determined by the marks awarded by the adjudicator. Ties may occur in aggregates.
  - (b) INSTRUMENTAL CHAMPIONSHIP AGGREGATE: The Instrumental Championship Aggregate winner is defined as the competitor who gains the highest point aggregate in their respective Championship (Items 201 to 203), Solo by Australian Composer (Items 205 to 207) and Quick Study (Items 208 to 211), plus Sonata (Item 204), on the same instrument.

### 6. SPEECH & DRAMA COMPETITIONS

- 6.1 USE OF LANGUAGE: All selections must be performed in English.
- 6.2 COSTUMES AND PROPS: Attention should be paid to the Item Rules regarding the use of costumes and props. Where permitted, props must adhere to the conditions in Clause 2.3.
- 6.3 IMPROVISATION ITEMS: Improvisation absence from room: Competitors in Improvisation Items (Items 304 and 354) must be in attendance prior to the commencement of their Item to be assembled by the Conductor of Sessions.

During Improvisations Items, no other competitor, teacher of a competitor, parent or family member of a competitor will be permitted to have any contact whatsoever with a competitor until their performance in the relevant Item has been completed.

6.4 SPEECH & DRAMA AGGREGATES: These will be determined as follows and apply to the Items listed below:

- (a) CALCULATION OF AGGREGATES: The Speech & Drama Championship Aggregate and Youth Speech & Drama Aggregate (16 to 20 years) shall each be calculated on the basis of 6 points for 1st Place, 5 points for 2nd Place, 4 points for 3rd Place, 3 points for 4th Place, 2 points for 5th Place, and 1 point for 6th Place in each of the relevant Items. Places are determined by the marks awarded by the adjudicator. Ties may occur in aggregates.
- (b) SPEECH & DRAMA CHAMPIONSHIP AGGREGATE: The Speech & Drama Championship Aggregate winner is defined as the competitor who gains the highest point aggregate in the Speech & Drama Championship (Item 301), Verse Speaking (the highest ranking between Items 302 or 303 will be applied), Improvisation (Item 304), and Character Recital (Item 305).
- (c) YOUTH SPEECH & DRAMA AGGREGATE: The Youth Speech & Drama Aggregate (16 to 20 years) winner is defined as the competitor who gains the highest point aggregate in the Youth Speech & Drama Championship (Item 351), Verse Speaking (the highest ranking between Items 352 or 353 will be applied), Improvisation (Item 354), and Character Recital (Item 355).

### **7. OWN CHOICE SELECTION**

- 7.1 MATERIAL: Own choice material (content and presentation) must be suitable to be performed at an Eisteddfod. Careful consideration should be given to the use of language that could be offensive. No coarse language is permitted in any performance. Offending competitors may be disqualified.
- 7.2 OWN CHOICE USE: In all Items other than Choral Items (see Clause 3.3b), competitors are not permitted to perform own choice selections with which they have won a first prize in the previous Queensland Eisteddfod.
- 7.3 PERFORMANCE LIMIT: An own choice selection may be performed in only one Item.
- 7.4 SUBMISSION OF OWN CHOICE MATERIAL: Competitors in all own choice items must submit a copy of their selection to the Eisteddfod Office in accordance with the requirements set down by the ECQ. The copy must be accompanied by an identification form plus a copyright declaration in accordance with Clause 8.1.

### 8. COPYRIGHT ARRANGEMENTS

8.1 COPYRIGHT: There are copyright requirements of national administering organisations to which the ECQ and competitors must adhere when they are using and/or copying published music or literary works.

Prior to their first appearance at the eisteddfod, all competitors must complete and submit to the Eisteddfod Office a "Copyright Declaration Form", listing all music that the competitor will perform at the eisteddfod, ie. set pieces and own choice selections.

- 8.2 ADJUDICATOR'S COPY: Any photocopies of own choice material must be marked as "Adjudication Purposes Only" and will be destroyed by the ECQ after each session. Copies must be accompanied by the appropriate form located in the Competition Programme. The competitor will not be permitted to perform if the adjudication copy is not submitted in accordance with these rules (see Clause 7.4).
- 8.3 COPYRIGHT RESPONSIBILITY: The ECQ is not responsible for any infringement of copyright or royalty by individual performers, or those associated with the performances, who use copied material at their own risk.

### 9. OFFICIAL ACCOMPANISTS

- 9.1 PROVISION OF OFFICIAL ACCOMPANISTS: Official Accompanists will be provided by the ECQ when necessary for the Vocal and Instrumental Items staged during the Eisteddfod. Competitors may engage their own accompanists. Competitors requiring the official accompanist for rehearsal should make their own arrangements with the accompanist. The agreed fee as advised is to be paid direct to the accompanist.
- 9.2 SUBMISSION OF MUSIC: Competitors in own choice Vocal and Instrumental Items requiring an Official Accompanist are requested to have the music in the hands of the nominated accompanist by **20th March 2025.** Accompanist contact details will be listed in the official Programme available February 2025.
- 9.3 Official accompanists are assigned to particular sessions, requiring them to remain at that venue to ensure no delays in the program. Competitors may therefore be required to perform with more than one Official Accompanist, depending on the scheduling of Items.
- 9.4 Official Accompanists may be engaged for accompanying on a private basis for sessions when they are not on duty as the Official Accompanist at another venue.

### **10. ADJUDICATION**

- 10.1 AWARD ON MERIT: No prizes will be awarded unless, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, performances attain an appropriate level of merit. Tied placings are not awarded.
- 10.2 TIME LIMITS: Where time limits are specified, they must be strictly applied. A bell will be rung at the expiration of the time and the performance will not be adjudicated after that time.
- 10.3 REPORT SHEETS: Adjudicator report sheets may be obtained from the Eisteddfod Office after each Item has concluded. Competitors unsuccessful in reaching a Final may obtain their report sheets after the conclusion of the last preliminary held for that Item. Report sheets are free of charge.
- 10.4 APPEALS: The Adjudicator's decision is final and may not be appealed, except in the case when it contravenes these rules.
- 10.5 COMMUNICATION WITH THE ADJUDICATOR: Competitors, teachers, parents, guardians or other interested parties shall not communicate with the Adjudicator during the Eisteddfod until they have completed their final competition, except for ECQ Management Committee members, who may communicate with the adjudicator only in their capacity as an ECQ Management Committee member.
- 10.6 At no time during competition should there be more than one adjudicator seated at the adjudication table.

### **11. CONDUCT OF SESSIONS**

- 11.1 ATTENDANCE: Competitors must be available at the time scheduled for their Item. Competitors are to report to the Conductor of the Session before the commencement of the Item.
- 11.2 COMPETITOR ORDER: The Conductor of Sessions reserves the right to change competitor order of appearance in Items. Competitors who are concerned at the possibility of a clash of Items should alert the Conductor of Sessions of the respective sessions who should take every possible step to accommodate them. It is the responsibility of competitors to ensure they return to venues as soon as possible to compete. Involvement in Choral Items shall take precedence.

- 11.3 STAGE RESTRICTION: No teacher shall be allowed on the stage or platform to assist a competitor, except as Accompanist or Conductor.
- 11.4 PROMPTING: Prompts may come only from the adjudication table.

### **12. AUDITORIUM RULES**

- 12.1 YOUTH ENTRY: Youth Choral competitors will be admitted to the venue free of charge.
- 12.2 RECORDING: Due to copyright and privacy issues, still photography and video or audio recording is forbidden, unless specifically authorised by the ECQ for official purposes.
- 12.3 SILENCE: Mobile phones and pagers must be switched off or to silent mode when in any performance venue.
- 12.4 ADMITTANCE: No one will be permitted to enter or leave a venue while a competitor is performing. Please remain seated during all performances.

### AGGREGATES AND SPECIAL AWARDS

Each discipline of competition in the Queensland Eisteddfod has at least one Aggregate award attached to it. Full detail can be found in the Terms and Conditions (Clauses 3.6, 4.6, 5.3, and 6.4), but summaries are below. Entry into Aggregates is automatic with entry into the listed Items of Competition.
